
Stitched Hedgehog Family





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Materials:

DMC thread(tan, brown, black, red) Needle Scissors Muslin

Directions:

- 1. Gather your materials and print the patterns.
- 2. On your piece of muslin trace the hedgehogs you want to stitch. I do this using a window or glass door. I tape the pattern on the window then hold my piece of muslin on the pattern and trace it onto the fabric with a pencil.
- 3. Now you're ready to begin stitching your hedgehogs. (Hint: Sometimes I put a second piece of muslin or a piece of white felt behind the muslin that I traced the pattern on. It hides the thread between stitches and gives it a quilted look.)
- 4. Choose a DMC color to start with. Thread your needle, tie a knot on one end of your DMC and start stitching following the lines you traced using a running stitch. Tie a knot at the end of each color and snip the thread. Stitch until your hedgies are finished.
- 5. Sit back and admire your handiwork. Now you can make a little pillow, a softie, decorate dish towels or frame your little hedgies. Whatever you decide do, enjoy them! Email any questions or comments to: jillytacy(at)yahoo(dot)com.
