



Prim Sheep Pineapple Stack

Prim Sheep Pineapple Stack

Materials:

DMC thread(white, black, green, red, yellow, dark blue)
Muslin - approx. 6" x 12"
White felt or batting – approx. 6" x 12"
Fabric scraps(white, black, green, red, yellow, dark blue)
Needle
Scissors
Red & Brown crayon or colored pencils
Frame for a 6" x 12" picture

Directions:

1. Using the pattern cut your fabric pieces:
 - Flag and sheep's body in white fabric.
 - Pineapple in yellow
 - Pineapple stem in green.
 - Hearts in red
 - Sheep's head in black.
 - Flag square in dark blue
2. Cut both your muslin and felt pieces to measure approx. 6" x 12". (Hint: I add a little extra here and cut it off when I'm done so I might cut my muslin and felt to be 7" x 13".)
3. Stack your muslin on top of your felt and pin along the edges to hold it in place. You can baste around the edges instead of pinning.
4. Following the pattern, place your pre-cut fabric pieces on the muslin to create your Prim Sheep Pineapple Stack. Then pin your pieces to the muslin.
5. Using your needle and DMC thread stitch your pieces in place. I match the color of my DMC to the color of the fabric and stitch around the edge using a running stitch. I stitch through both the muslin & felt. This gives it a bit of a quilted look. If you are not planning to frame your Prim Sheep Pineapple Stack you'll want finished edges so you will need to turn under your edges then use a whip stitch to applique them into place.
6. Once all of your pieces are stitched into place use your brown crayon or colored pencil to color the flag pole. Use your red to color stripes on the flag.
7. Now you're ready to frame your Prim Sheep Pineapple Stack. I lay the glass from the frame on my finished picture. I center the glass on the picture then cut the excess fabric off. Place the glass and your Prim Sheep Pineapple Stack in the frame. (Hint: I used a wood frame but painted it white & wiped off the paint before it dried to make it more prim.)
